

Problem 1


Compare the width and the length of ribbons.

- 4. Draw a horizontal line inside the narrowest ribbon.




Problem 2



Problem 3 Find the shadow of each cat.




Problem 4Name all the objects that are hidden in this picture.




Problem 5




Problem 6Draw a line from each picture to the letter that makes its beginning sound. Color the pictures.
